To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in General Court assembled:

The undersigned legislators and/or citizens respectfully petition for the passage of the accompanying bill:

An Act Establishing a Parent Participation Plan in Public Schools.

PETITION OF:

- 1 Parent Participation.
- 2 Each school council shall develop a parent participation plan (herein "plan") in consultation with
- 3 other parent councils, parent advisory committees and other parent organizations. The plan shall
- 4 be directed at eliminating barriers to parent participation and creating opportunities for
- 5 involvement. This plan shall be filed with the Department of Education. It shall be written in
- 6 clearly understandable language and distributed in the language of the home of each household
- 7 with a child attending that school.
- 8
- 9 A. Information Provided to Parents. Each plan shall contain information pertinent to informed
- 10 participation by parents. At a minimum it shall contain:
- 1. A description of the curriculum of the school, the manner in which it was developed and the
- 12 goals it seeks to accomplish;
- 13 2. A description of the manner in which the school will address issues of cultural and ethnic
- 14 diversity through the curriculum and other school activities;
- 15 3. A description of the school budget, how allocation decisions were made, and the rationale for
- 16 those decisions;
- 17 4. A description of how staff are assigned;
- 18 5. A description of how students are assigned;
- 19 6. A description of school discipline practices and classroom management. This description shall
- 20 especially set out alternatives to suspension or expulsion;
- 21 7. A description indicating school dropout rates, grade retentions, and suspensions.

- 23 B. Opportunities for Participation. Each plan shall specifically address the manner in which
- 24 participation opportunities will be maximized. It shall describe how:

- 1. The school will develop programs including training and direct instruction to help families
- 26 develop skills to support their children's developmental needs;
- 27 2. The school will meet the goal of building effective and consistent communication between the28 school and home;
- 3. The school will provide opportunities for families to assist the school in pursuit of theeducational objectives;
- 4. The school will provide guidance and assistance to families to provide learning activities in
- the home that support the work of their children at school, including strategies parents can use to improve academic success;
- 5. The school will create joint decision-making opportunities and participation in the
- 35 development of school policy;
- 6. The school will create opportunities for parents to raise new issues relevant to the educationalneeds of students.

- C. Parent Conferences. Each participation plan shall guarantee an opportunity for a minimum of
- 40 two individual and confidential parent teacher conferences a year. The purpose of these
- 41 conferences will be to discuss the mutual expectations of the parents and the school concerning
- 42 the educational progress of the child, to review whether those expectations are being met and to
- 43 discuss improvements which should be considered and implemented.
- 44 Nothing in this section shall be construed to mean that parents or the school may not request
- 45 additional conferences as needed and said conferences shall not be unreasonably denied.

- 47 D. School Visitation. Notwithstanding any other provision of the participation plan, the school
- shall guarantee reasonable access to the school for the parent or the parent's designee for the
- 49 purposes of classroom observation. Nothing in this section shall be construed to deny or limit
- 50 access to the school for other reasons.
- 51 E. Compliance with Parent Participation Plan. Upon petition of five percent or more of the
- bouseholds in any school, except that for schools of less than 200 students the number shall be
- 53 10 households, the Department of Education shall hold a hearing if the petition asserts that a) the
- school has not developed a parent participation plan which meets the minimum requirements of
- this law or b) the school has failed to implement the provisions of the plan as adopted.
- If the Department finds that the conditions described in "a" or "b" of this section exist, it shall have the authority to order remedial actions to insure compliance.

- If a school fails to comply with remedial orders of the Department, the Department may apply
- such sanctions as it deems appropriate, including a withholding of state funds or some portion
 thereof. Upon compliance, such funds shall be restored.

- 63 F. Exceptional Parent Participation Plans. The Department of Education may from time to time
- 64 issue certificates and awards of excellence to schools which have complied with this law and
- 65 have maximized opportunities for parent participation.

- 67 G. Additional Provisions. Any school may include in its parent participation plans additional
- 68 provisions which exceed the minimum requirements of this law. However, in no event may a

- 69 school develop plans that result in negative consequences to a student if parents fail or are unable
- 70 to pursue the opportunities provided in this law.
