## AN ACT PROHIBITING TEXT MESSAGING, AND READING, WRITING, OR SENDING ELECTRONIC MESSAGING WHILE DRIVING.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1           SECTION 2. Said chapter 90, as so appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2        further amended by inserting after section 13A the following section:—
- 3        Section 13B. Except as provided in Section 13 of this chapter, a person
- 4        operating a moving motor vehicle who, by means of a mobile telephone or an
- 5        electronic wireless communications device, other than a voice-activated global
- 6        positioning or navigation system that is permanently affixed to the vehicle, sends, reads,
- 7        or writes a text message, is guilty of a secondary motor vehicle violation.
- 8        As used in this Section, a mobile telephone means an electronic wireless device that
- 9        has an internal feature or function for wireless communications that shall include, but is
- 10      not limited to talking or listening to another person on the telephone, text messaging,
- 11      or sending an electronic or text message to another mobile wireless telephone or other
- 12      electronic communication devices.

13 Enforcement of the provisions of this section prohibiting text messaging or sending, reading, writing,  
14 and responding to an electronic message via a mobile telephone or other electronic communication  
15 device during the operation of a motor vehicle by State or local law enforcement officers shall be  
16 enforced as a secondary motor vehicle offense.
