### AN ACT RELATIVE TO MEMBERSHIP OF THE COSMETOLOGY BOARD OF REGISTRATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority  
of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 42 of Chapter 13 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is  
2 hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the word “seven” and inserting in place thereof the following figure:—

4           SECTION 2: Said section 42 of said chapter 13, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by striking out  
5 the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

6           The governor shall appoint members to the board from among candidates who meet the following  
7 qualifications: (a) 5 members who shall be licensed cosmetologists, in compliance with sections 87T to 87KK,  
8 inclusive, of chapter 112, one of whom shall own a licensed cosmetology school and have a minimum of a bachelors  
9 degree or who has at least 10 years experience in the field, one of whom has attained a minimum of a bachelors  
10 degree shall be a type one hairdresser for at least 10 years and who shall be a member of the Massachusetts  
11 Cosmetology Association for at least 10 years, one of whom shall be a licensed type one hairdresser and shop owner  
12 for at least 10 years, one of whom shall be a licensed vocational educator from the public sector who has taught  
13 cosmetology for at least 10 years, and one of whom shall be a licensed aesthetician for at least 10 years; (b) 2 of  
14 whom shall be a representative of the general public, one of whom shall be a parent of a cosmetology student, and  
15 one of whom shall have no direct affiliation with the practice of cosmetology; and (c) 1 of whom shall be a member  
16 from the department of education and 1 of whom shall be a member from the division of apprenticeship training of  
17 the department of labor and workforce development. No board member shall be affiliated directly or indirectly
