**AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PENALTY FOR INTERFERING WITH CERTAIN MEDICAL  
PERSONNEL IN THE LINE OF DUTY.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority  
of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 265 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 13I, as appearing  
2 in the 2004 Official Edition and inserting in place thereof the following section: -

3           Section 13I. Whoever commits an assault and batter on an emergency medical technician, an ambulance  
4 operator, registered nurse, registered nurse psychologist, physical therapist, occupational therapist, ambulance  
5 attendant, nurse's aide, diagnostic technician including phlebotomists and EKG technician and security officer,  
6 while said technician, operator, registered nurse, registered nurse psychologist, physical therapist, occupational  
7 therapist, attendant, nurse's aide, diagnostic technicians, including phlebotomists and EKG technicians, radiology  
8 technicians and security officers is treating or transporting, in the line of duty, shall be punished by imprisonment in  
9 the house of correction for not less than 90 days nor more than 2 1/2 years or by a fine of not less than \$500 nor  
10 more than \$5,000, or both.
