## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand and Nine  
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### AN ACT ESTABLISHING LOCAL SCHOOL HEALTH ADVISORY COUNCILS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 7I of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 54B the  
2 following section:-

3           Section 54C. The school committee of each school district shall establish a local school health  
4 education advisory council to assist the district in ensuring that local community values are reflected in  
5 the district's health education instruction and wellness programs.

6           A school district must consider the recommendations of the local school health education  
7 advisory council before changing the district's health education curriculum or instruction.

8           The local school health advisory council's duties include recommending:- (a) the number  
9 of hours of instruction to be provided in health education;(b) health education curriculum  
10 appropriate for specific grade levels that shall incorporate the Massachusetts Comprehensive  
11 Health Curriculum Framework and that may include a coordinated health education program  
12 consistent with guidelines based on the American School Health Association's Comprehensive  
13 School Health Program and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention coordinated school  
14 health program designed to prevent obesity, cardiovascular disease, and Type II diabetes  
15 through coordination of the following nine elements:

16                   (i) health services;

17                   (ii) health education;

- 18 (iii) school nutrition services;
- 19 (iv) physical education;
- 20 (v) healthy school environment;
- 21 (vi) school counseling;
- 22 (vii) school psychological and social services;
- 23 (viii) staff health and wellness; and
- 24 (ix) family and community involvement.

25 The school committee shall appoint members to the local school health advisory council. A majority  
26 of the members must be persons who are parents of students enrolled in the district and who are not  
27 employed by the district. The board of trustees also may appoint one or more persons from each of the  
28 following groups or a representative from a group other than a group specified under this subsection:  
29 public school teachers, public school administrators, students, licensed health care professionals, the  
30 business community, law enforcement, senior citizens, the clergy and nonprofit organizations.

31 The department of education shall monitor and act as a clearing house for the activities of the local  
32 school health advisory councils.

33 The department shall also notify each school district of the availability of professional development  
34 opportunities on school health issues.

35 Each local school district shall develop an action plan prepared in collaboration with the local school  
36 health advisory council to assist in implementation of health education and wellness policies. The action  
37 plan shall identify steps that need to be taken each year to fully implement the policy and shall include a  
38 review and appropriate modification of existing physical education and health curricula.

39 SECTION 2. The department of education shall conduct a cost analysis study under the direction of  
40 the commissioner and the advisory board established pursuant to section 12 of chapter 6 to identify the  
41 annual costs associated with continuously funding comprehensive health education resources to be  
42 used by local health advisory councils to assist in meeting district health education action plans, goals  
43 and objectives. The study shall be completed and reported to the general court and the governor by  
44 April, 2008.

45 The department shall also notify each school district of the availability of professional development  
46 opportunities and resources in school health education issues.

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
