### AN ACT RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE FINES FOR PROSTITUTION..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 1. Chapter 272 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 8, and inserting in place  
2 thereof the following section:—

4 Section 8.

5 Notwithstanding any general or special law, a person convicted of the crime of soliciting for a prostitute under  
6 General Laws chapter 272, section 8 or otherwise shall be punished by imprisonment in the house of correction for  
7 not more than one (1) year and shall be punished by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and not  
8 more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the first offense, not less than seven hundred fifty dollars  
9 (\$750.00) and not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the second offense, and not less than one thousand  
10 dollars (\$1,000.00) and not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the third offense and every subsequent  
11 offense thereafter.

13 Section 8(a)

14 Notwithstanding any general or special law, a person charged with the crime of soliciting for a prostitute under  
15 General Laws chapter 272, section 8 or otherwise shall, if the disposition of the charge is other than acquittal or  
16 dismissal, be assessed a civil fine of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) and not more than three hundred  
17 dollars (\$300.00) for the first offense, not less than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) and not more than five hundred  
18 dollars (\$500.00) for the second offense, and not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and not more than one  
19 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the third offense and every subsequent offense thereafter.
