### AN ACT RELATIVE TO A POLICEMAN'S BILL OF RIGHTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1		1 SECTION 1. Chapter 31 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2	2	the 2000 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
3	3	following new section:—
4	4	Section 4IB. The interrogations into alleged misconduct of a
5	5	police officer shall take place at a location designated by the
6	6	investigating officer. The officer shall be informed of the rank,
7	7	name and command of the officer in charge of the investigation
8	8	and of all persons present during the interrogation. The officer
9	9	shall be informed of the nature of the interrogation and shall be
10	10	informed of the name of all complainants.
11	11	The interrogation shall be conducted at a reasonable hour and
12	12	in a reasonable manner, preferably at a time when the officer is on
13	13	duty. Interrogation sessions shall be for reasonable periods and

14 shall be flexible to allow for personal necessities. The law

- 15 enforcement officer shall not be subject to offensive language or
- 16 be threatened with transfer, dismissal, or disciplinary action.
- 17 If the police officer is under arrest or is likely to be placed
- 18 under arrest, he shall be completely informed of all his rights prior
- 19 19 to commencement of the interrogation. At the officer's request, he
- 20 shall have the right to be represented by counsel. All questions
- 21 and answers shall be recorded by a stenographer.
- 22 No law enforcement officer shall be discharged, disciplined,
- 23 demoted, denied transfer or reassignment with regard to his
- 24 employment, or be threatened with any such treatment by reason
- 25 of his exercise of the rights granted by this section.
- 26 1 SECTION 2. Section 25 of Chapter 268A of the General Laws,
- 27 as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is further amended by

- 30 5 during the course of duty shall be subject to the provisions of sec-
