AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SPAYING AND NEUTERING OF CATS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1 . Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2	section 174D the following section:-
3	
4	Section 174E. No person shall own or harbor, within the commonwealth any cat over the
5	age of 6 months which has not been spayed or neutered, unless such person holds a
6	license to keep an unaltered cat or a license and permit for breeding cats issued by the
7	board of health of the city or town in which they live or unless the caretakers, due to age,
8	health or illness and having in their possession a letter from a licensed veterinarian stating
9	such, which shall be provided to the board of health.
10	
11	An intact permit shall be issued for an unaltered cat if the owner signs a written statement
12	that such animal will not be allowed to breed unless the owner has first obtained a
13	breeding permit. An intact permit may be issued by the board of health to a person who
14	refuses to spay or neuter their cat. The fee for such permit shall be \$100 per year. All
15	funds shall be deposited in the city or town's spay-neutered account. Any person
16	providing care or sustenance for a period of 30 days or longer shall be deemed the owner
17	of such animal, and shall adhere to the provisions of this section and must also:
18	
19	1) Register, at no charge, with the city or town in which they live as a caretaker for
20	feral cats;
21	2) Regularly feed or arrange for the feeding of the colony, including on weekends
22	and holidays;
23	3) Trap or make a reasonable effort to trap all feral cats over the age of 8 weeks in
24	his care and have them spayed or neutered;
25	4) Identify feral cats that have been spayed or neutered by means of ear notching,
26	ear tipping or ear tagging;

5) Have all trapped cats vaccinated in accordance with state and local laws. 27 28 29 30 No person shall cause or allow any cat owned or harbored in the city or town in which they live to breed without first obtaining a breeding permit under this section. 31 32 Each city or town board of health shall administer a permit program to allow the breeding 33 of cats consistent with criteria and according to procedures contained in city or town 34 ordinances or bylaws, provided, however that where the city or town ordinances or 35 bylaws specially prohibit the breeding of cats the city or town ordinances or bylaw shall 36 37 govern. 38 Each applicant who is issued a permit to breed cats shall pay a fee of \$100 per year. 39 40 No person shall cause or allow the breeding of a male or female cat without first 41 obtaining a breeding permit issued by the animal control officer. Breeding permits shall 42 be valid for 12 months, renewable on an annual basis for a fee of \$100. 43 44 Herein, all breeding permits shall contain the following terms and conditions and be 45 subject to all of the following requirements: 46 47 6) No offspring may be sold or adopted and permanently placed until reaching an 48 age of at least 8 weeks: 49 7) No offspring shall be sold or adopted until immunized against common diseases; 50 8) If within 60 days of placement a new owner becomes unable or unwilling to 51 52 continue ownership and responsibility for an animal, the permit holder shall assist in placement of the animal. If no suitable placement can be found the permit 53 holder may accept return of the animal if healthy and shall become fully 54 responsible for its care; 55 9) Any permit holder advertising to the public the availability of any animal for 56 adoption or sale must prominently display the permit number in any publications 57 in which they advertise. The permit number must be provided to any person 58 59 adopting or purchasing any animal bred by the permit holder; 10) The breeding permit holder shall adhere to minimum standards regarding the care 60 and keeping of animals developed and approved by the board of health and state 61 62 law. 63 Any person who provides or offers to the public, whether or not for compensation, any pet or pet related goods, where they are the primary products, or pet services shall 64 65 provide to their clients, at no charge, information relating to pet care and ownership, including information on city and town laws pertaining to animal control. 66 67 68 Any person offering cats for sale or adoption shall disclose to a purchaser or adoptive 69 owner, information regarding the licensing or permit requirements of the city or town in which they reside applicable to the animal. 70 71

72	No person shall offer for sale or adoption any cat on any public street, sidewalk or public
73	park unless the person first obtains approval from the city or town's board of health or a
74	business license to sell pets.
75	
76	Any permit issued may be revoked if the animal control officer has reasonable cause to
77	believe any of the following to be true:
78	1) The permittee has violated any state or local ordinances relating to the keeping,
79	care or use of any animal;
80	2) The permittee is in violation of any state health or safety law or regulation
81	regarding animal care or control;
82	3) The permittee has failed to comply with any condition or requirement of the
83	permit or has failed to pay any fee imposed under this section;
84	4) The permittee refuses to allow inspection upon 48 hours of written notice, of any
85	cat covered by the permit or the premises on which the animal is kept;
86	5) The permittee has transferred, sold or otherwise disposed of the cat for which the
87	permit was issued.
88	permit was issued.
89	If, after investigation, the animal control officer concludes that it is probable that one or
90	more of the above grounds for revocation has occurred, he or she shall cause written
90 91	notice thereof to be transmitted by mail to the address of the permittee. The notice shall
91 92	specify the grounds of possible revocation of the permit, and shall specify a date and time
92 93	for an informal hearing to be held before the animal control officer. The date shall be not
	•
94	less than 5 days subsequent to the date the notice is mailed. After the informal hearing,
95	the animal control officer may modify the terms of the permit or revoke the permit.
96	
97	Farmland, defined as any tract of land, including woodland and wasteland constituting a
98	farm unit which is actively devoted to agricultural or horticultural use including, but not
99	limited to: forages and sod crops; grains and feed crops; fruits and vegetables; poultry,
100	diary, and other livestock and their products; nursery, floral and greenhouse products, and
101	any other food or fiber products useful to people; shall be exempt from the provisions of
102	this chapter.
103	
104	If any cat is abandoned by their owner or any person having charge or custody of that cat,
105	that person shall, for each offense be punished by a fine of \$250 for first offense and
106	\$500 for each offense thereafter.
107	
108	Each city or town shall collect 50¢ surcharge on each dog license issued by the
109	municipality. The revenue generated by this surcharge shall be deposited in the
110	respective city and town's spay/neuter account to fund low cost spay/neuter programs.
111	
112	Any person who violates the permit provision of this section shall have no more than 30
113	days to have their cat spayed or neutered or provide proof from a licensed veterinarian
114	indicating arrangements have been made to spay or neuter their cat or cats. The board of
115	health shall inform persons subject to this law of the availability or reduced cost or free
116	spay or neuter programs sponsored by local humane organizations. If a cat is not spayed
117	or neutered within 30 days of the notice, the person shall be subject to \$100 fine for each

- 30 days the cat is not spayed or neutered. Funds generated pursuant to this section shall
 be deposited in the spay-neuter account of the city or town where the violation occurred.
 The local board of health shall be responsible for the enforcement of this section.
- SECTION 2. Persons harboring a cat subject to this section on the effective date thereof
 shall be given 120 days from that date to comply with the provisions of this section.
