AN ACT RELATIVE TO INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR AUTISM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

3 Section 24.

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(a) The commission shall provide to any active or retired employee of the commonwealth who is insured under the group insurance commission benefits on a nondiscriminatory basis to residents of the commonwealth and to all policyholders having a principal place of employment in the commonwealth for the diagnosis and treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorder in individuals.

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(b) Any such policy shall be deemed to be providing such benefits on a nondiscriminatory basis if the policy does not contain any annual or lifetime dollar or unit of service limitation on coverage for the diagnosis and treatment of said Autism Spectrum Disorders which is less than any annual or lifetime dollar or unit of service limitation imposed on coverage for the diagnosis and treatment of physical conditions.

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(c) This section will not be construed as limiting benefits that are otherwise available to an individual under a health insurance policy.

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(d) Coverage under this section will not be subject to any limits on the number of visits an individual may make to an autism services provider.

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(e) This section will not be construed as affecting any obligation to provide services to an individual
 under an individualized family service plan, an individualized education program, or an individualized
 service plan.

(f) Definitions - As used in this section:

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1. "Applied behavior analysis" means the design, implementation, and evaluation of environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to produce socially significant improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the relationship between environment and behavior.

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2. "Autism services provider" means any person, entity, or group that provides treatment of autismspectrum disorders.

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11. "Treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorders" will include the following care prescribed, provided, or ordered for an individual diagnosed with one of the autism spectrum disorders by a licensed physician
