AN ACT RELATIVE TO CAUSATION IN PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 60K of Chapter 231 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the end thereof the following new section:

4 Section 60L:

5 In any action for malpractice, negligence, error, omission, mistake or unauthorized rendering of
6 professional services, against a provider of health care, the plaintiff shall have the burden of proving the
7 following:

8 (1) The recognized standard of acceptable professional practice in the profession and the specialty
9 thereof, if any, that the defendant practices in the community in which he practices or in a similar
10 community at the time the alleged injury or wrongful action occurred;

11 (2) That the defendant acted with less than or failed to act with ordinary and reasonable care in
12 accordance with such standard; and

13 (3) As a direct and proximate result of the defendant's negligent act or omission, the plaintiff suffered
14 injuries which would not otherwise have occurred.

15 (4) The plaintiff was a patient of the defendant and had a professional relationship to the defendant
16 which created a duty of care on the defendant's part or where the plaintiff is a reasonably identifiable
17 victim of the patient of a defendant psychotherapist to whom the patient communicated a serious
18 threat of physical violence against the plaintiff.
