AN ACT TO REGULATE HEALTH INSURANCE CONTRACTS/POLICIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 24B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph the following paragraph:
- 3 The commissioner shall also require health care insurers, including any self-insured sickness, 4 health, or welfare plan under this section, to recover all payments due from patients for 5 covered services. For purposes of this section, payments due from patients for covered 6 services include deductibles and co-insurance, and shall further be attributed to each patient 7 on an annual basis or for the period of the patient's period of coverage. Said health care insurers shall include payments due from patients for covered health care services in their 8 9 payments to providers; provided however, that such payment shall not be delayed based on a delay in recovering the payment due from the patient. Nothing in this section shall prohibit 10

providers and insurers from mutually agreeing to alternative billing and payment processes

- when it has been determined that the patient has or can obtain secondary insurance coverage
- for the services provided.
- 14 SECTION 2. The commissioner of insurance shall promulgate regulations to enforce the
- provisions of this Act no later than 90 days after the effective date of the Act. Such regulations
- shall be effective for provider contracts and enrollees' policies which are entered into, renewed,
- or amended on or after the regulations effective date.
