AN ACT PROVIDING TRAINING FOR CERTAIN LOCAL BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 17 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new section:—

3 7B. The department shall establish, conduct and maintain an annual program of education and
4 training for members of local boards of health; provided, however, that the department shall consult
5 with the Massachusetts Association of Boards of Health in the development of said program; provided,
6 further, that the department may contract with the Massachusetts Association of Boards of Health to
7 provide such education and training. All education and training courses shall be free of charge to board
8 members and, to the extent practicable, be offered in various locations throughout the commonwealth.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 21A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby
10 amended by inserting after section fifteen the following new section:—

11 15A. The department of environmental protection shall establish, conduct and maintain an
12 annual program of education and training for members of local conservation commissions; provided,
13 however, that the department shall consult with the Massachusetts Association of Conservation

14 Commissions in the development of said program; provided, further, that the department may contract
15 with the Massachusetts Association of Conservation Commissions to provide such education and
16 training. All education and training courses shall be free of charge to commission members and, to the
17 extent practicable, be offered in various locations throughout the commonwealth.
