**AN ACT DIRECTING THE STATE RETIREMENT BOARD TO RETIRE ROBERT EMMET  
FITZGERALD.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority  
of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, and in order to  
2 promote the public good, the State Retirement Board is hereby authorized and directed to retire Robert  
3 Emmet Fitzgerald, a former State Police Officer, who as a result of injuries sustained while in the  
4 performance of his duties as an undercover State Police narcotics officer, is incapacitated from further  
5 service as a State Trooper.

7 Robert Emmet Fitzgerald was seriously injured (PTSD) due to his isolation in "B" Troop for two years  
8 posing as a heroin addict. Little administrative and professional back up support was available at this  
9 time.

11 The annual amount of pension payable to Robert Emmet Fitzgerald shall be fixed in an amount equal to  
12 the regular rate of compensation which would have been paid had he continued in service as a State  
13 Trooper up to the March 13, 1991 formal notification of then Secretary of Public Safety James B. Roche.  
14 It will also be retroactive to that date and include health benefits.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
