## AN ACT ESTABLISHING A GOLF LICENSE PLATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 90 section 2 shall be amended by adding at the end thereof the following section:

- (d) The registrar shall furnish, upon application, to the owners of private passenger motor vehicles
- 4 distinctive registration plates which shall display on their face a design to be determined by the registrar
- 5 depicting an image relating to the game of golf. There shall be a fee of not less than thirty dollars for such
- 6 plates in addition to the established registration fee for private passenger motor vehicles, such fee being
- 7 payable at the time of registration of such vehicle and at each renewal thereof. The portion of the total fee
- 8 remaining after the deduction of costs directly attributable to the issuance of such plates shall be deposited
- 9 within ninety days of receipt thereof in a special fund in the office Massachusetts Office of Travel and
- Tourism to be used solely for the purpose of promoting golf in Massachusetts.
- 11 There shall be established within the Massachusetts Office of Travel and Tourism a special fund into
- which amounts received from the sale of the Massachusetts golf registration plate shall be deposited. Said
- 13 funds shall be used for the promotion of golf in Massachusetts. Promotion of golf in Massachusetts may
- be accomplished by direct advertising, contracting with private entities to conduct such promotion,
- providing grants to private and public agencies and entities upon application for funds, or in any manner
- the office of Travel and Tourism determines.
