## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT CREATING A PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 7 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the following section after 1
- 2 section 56. Section 57. For the purpose of Sections 57 through 60 of this chapter the following terms

3 shall have the following meanings:-

- 4 "Agency", means an entity of the Executive Branch of State government.
- 5 "Executive Office" means the Executive Office for Administration and Finance.
- 6 "Goal" means a broad statement that describes the desired long-term results toward which an agency
- 7 directs its efforts. Goals support, clarify, and provide direction to the agency's mission and assist in the
- 8 application of State resources toward implementation of the managing for results State comprehensive plan.
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- 11 "Managing for results" means a planning, performance measurement, and budgeting process that
- 12 emphasizes use of resources to achieve measurable results, accountability, efficiency, and continuous
- 13 improvement in State government programs.
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- 15 "Mission" means the purpose for an agency's existence and includes a description of what an agency does 16 and for whom it does it.

"Objective" means a specific and measurable short-term target for achievement of an agency's goals andincludes a description of the desired results and a target date for accomplishment.

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- (1)"Performance measure" means a quantitative or qualitative indicator used to assess whether an agencyis meeting its goals and objectives.
- 22 (2) "Performance measure" includes the following:
- (i) an efficiency measure that quantifies the relationship between measures of the inputsused to produce goods or services and the measures of the outputs of these activities;
- 25 (ii) an input measure that quantifies the amount of resources used to provide goods and26 services;
- (iii) an outcome measure that quantifies the results an agency achieves or the benefitscitizens receive from an agency's activities;
- 29 (iv) an output measure that quantifies the amount of goods and services produced by the30 agency; and
- 31 (v) a quality measure that quantifies or describes:
- 32 1. the effectiveness of the agency in meeting agency objectives;
- 2. aspects of the satisfaction that customers may or may not have with State goods or services; or
- 34 3. how State goods or services compare to some external or internal standard.
- 35 "State comprehensive plan" means a statement of goals which serve as a broad directive for improving or
- 36 making more cost effective State resources and services. The plan shall include no more than 10 statewide
- 37 goals and 50 to 100 performance measures that describe the statewide progress towards its goals.
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- 39 "StateStat" means the accountability process described in Section 60 of this chapter.

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41 "Strategic plan" means a statement of direction implemented by an agency to carry out its mission.

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43 44	SECTION 3. Chapter 7 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the following section after section 58
45	59. Review of State Comprehensive Plan
46 47	(a) Review and update goals, objectives and measures of State comprehensive plan The Executive Office shall review and update as necessary:
48 49	(1) the goals developed in the managing for results State comprehensive plan; and
50	(2) the plan's objectives and performance measures.
51 52 53	(b) Selection of six goals Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, on or before July 1 of each year an agency, in conjunction with the Executive Office, shall select no more than six agency goals that are:
54	(1) compatible with the managing for results State comprehensive plan; or
55 56	(2) consistent with the agency's mission if the goals identified in the managing for results State comprehensive plan do not apply to the agency.
57 58	(c) Submission of agency strategic plan with budget Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, with
59 60 61	its annual budget submission to the Executive Office, an agency shall develop and submit to the Executive Office as part of the budget process a managing for results agency strategic plan that shall include:
62	(1) a mission statement;
63	(2) a description of the agency's goals;
64 65	(3) a description of the objectives and performance measures implemented at the program level to achieve the agency's goals, including:
66	(i) montaneous and an attiction for at least the 2 montaneous the completed figures
67 68	(i) performance measure statistics for at least the 2 most recently completed fiscal years; and
69 70	(ii) performance measure estimates for the current year appropriation and budget request year;

71 72	(4) a discussion of the agency's progress in meeting its goals and performance measures and any challenges the agency has faced in working toward its goals;
73 74	(5) a description of the internal controls established to ensure reliability of the data collected for each performance measure; and
75	(6) an identification of the customers and stakeholders served.
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77 78 79	(d) Documentation of internal controls An agency subject to this section shall maintain documentation of the internal controls established to evaluate performance measures that shall be subject to review by the State.
80	(e) Reports
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82 83 84	(1) The Executive Office shall provide a report to the Senate Committee on Ways and Means and House Committee on Ways and Means in January of each year on the contents of the State comprehensive plan and the State's progress toward the goals outlined in the plan.
85	(2) The report shall include details on each agency's progress.
86 87	(3) The Senate Committee on Ways and Means and House Committee on Ways and Means may hold hearings after receiving the report.
88 89	(4) The first report shall be submitted on or before January 31, 2010 and shall include a presentation of the first managing for results State comprehensive plan.
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91 92	SECTION 4. Chapter 7 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the following section after section 59
93	60. StateStat Process
94 95	The Secretary of Administration and Finance shall review the strategic plans and the State comprehensive plan and may recommend appropriate changes to agency budgets.
96	There is a Statestat process that is managed by the Executive Branch
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98	Statestat is an accountability process that involves:
99	The adoption of a strategic plan and the establishment of goals by an agency;
100	The adoption of a comprehensive set of performance and citizen satisfaction measurements by an agency;
101	Regular and frequent:
102	Submission of timely and accurate data by an agency;
103	Review and analysis of submitted data;
104	Accountability meetings to assess an agency's performance;
105	Continuous review of strategies and tactics used by an agency to meet the goals of the agency;
106	Continuous assessment of the progress of an agency towards meeting the goals of the agency.
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108	Requiring agency to use process – the Governor may require an agency to participate in the StateStat
109	process to help facilitate and accelerate the achievement of managing for results goals and objectives.
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111	Reports –
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113	Each agency that participates in the StateStat process shall submit a strategic plan and performance
114	measurement report to the Secretary as part of its annual budget submission.
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116	The Report submitted by each agency that participates in the StateStat process shall contain the
117	information required in section 59 of this chapter.
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119	SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon passage.
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
