AN ACT PROHIBITING THE RELEASE OF A MINOR'S PERSONAL INFORMATION BY THE MEDIA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 214 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 3B the following section:-
- 3 Section 3C. (a) For purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following
- 4 meanings:-
- 5 "Minor", a person under 18 years of age who is not a subject of legitimate public concern or
- 6 interest.
- 7 "Personal information", the name, address or electronic mail address of a minor as defined in this
- 8 section.
- 9 (b) No television station, radio station, internet website, or other electronic broadcast media
- outlet shall broadcast and no newspaper or magazine sold or distributed to the general public

- shall publish the personal information of any minor whose image appears in any broadcast or
- photograph without the express written consent of a parent or legal guardian of the minor.
- 13 (c) A parent or legal guardian of any minor whose personal information is broadcast or
- published in violation of this section may bring a civil action in the superior court on behalf of
- the minor and against the person or entity so using his personal information to prevent and
- restrain the use thereof and may recover damages for any injuries sustained because of the use of
- 17 the personal information.
