## AN ACT RELATIVE TO DECEASED POOR AND INDIGENT PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 117A of the General Laws is hereby
2	amended by striking out section 9 and inserting in place thereof the
3	following section:—
4	Section 9. The department shall provide for the decent final dis
5	position of all deceased persons who are at the time of death recipe
6	ents of aid or assistance under this chapter, all deceased persons
7	who, although without means of support at the time of death, did not
8	apply for such aid or assistance; and all unknown persons found
9	dead. The expense thereof may be recovered of their kindred, if any,
10	chargeable by law for their support in the manner provided in this
11	chapter; and if the expense of their funeral and final disposition is
12	not paid by such kindred, an amount not exceeding \$1,100 shall be
13	paid by the commonwealth to the funeral establishment; provided
14	further, that the commonwealth shall have the right of reimburse
15	ment from whatever resources may exist in the estate of said person.
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17	SECTION 2. Said chapter 117A is hereby further amended by
18	striking out section 10 and inserting in place thereof the following

section:-19 20 Section 10. In case of the decease of a poor and indigent person 21 the commonwealth shall pay toward the expense of the funeral and final disposition of such person a sum not exceeding eleven hundred 22 23 dollars to the funeral establishment; provided, however, that the 24 commonwealth shall have the right of reimbursement from whatever 25 resources may exist in the estate of said person. 26 27 SECTION 3. Section 2 of chapter 118 of the General Laws, as 28 appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby amended by 29 striking out the third paragraph and inserting place thereof the 30 following paragraph:— 31 "The department may pay a sum not exceeding \$1,100 toward the 32 funeral and final disposition of a recipient to the funeral establish 33 ment provided that there are insufficient resources to pay for the cost 34 of such funeral and final disposition. The commonwealth shall have the right of reimbursement from whatever resources may exist in the 35 36 estate of the recipient." 37 38 SECTION 4. Chapter 118A of the General Laws is hereby 39 amended by striking out section 7 and inserting in place thereof the following section:— 40 Section 7. The department shall provide to aged and disabled resi 41 42 dents of the commonwealth under this chapter a program of social 43 services as enumerated under section 2 of chapter 18. In addition to 44 the other benefits authorized by this chapter, the department may 45 provide to such recipients grants of assistance in cases of fire, flood, 46 or other disaster. The department may pay a sum not exceeding 47 \$1,100 toward the funeral and final disposition of a recipient to a 48 funeral establishment provided that there are insufficient resources to pay for the cost of such funeral and interment. The common 49 50 wealth shall have the right of reimbursement from whatever 51 resources may exist in the estate of the recipient.

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53	SECTION 5. Section 23 of chapter 119 of the General Laws, as
54	appearing in the 2004 Official Edition is hereby amended by striking
55	out the fifteenth paragraph and inserting in place thereof the
56	following paragraph:—
57	"H. The department may pay a sum not exceeding \$1,100 the
58	funeral and final disposition of a child in its care to a funeral estab
59	lishment provided that there are insufficient resources to pay for the
60	cost of such funeral and final disposition. The commonwealth shall
