AN ACT RELATIVE TO DISABLED VETERANS' MOTOR VEHICLE PLATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter
2 419 of the acts of 2006, is hereby amended by striking out the words, “according to the records
3 of the United States Veterans' Administration, has been determined to have a service-connected
4 disability rating of 60 per cent or greater and by reason of service in the armed forces of the
5 United States have suffered loss or permanent loss of use of one or both feet; or loss or
6 permanent loss of use of one or both hands; or permanent impairment of vision of both eyes of
7 the following status: central visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye, with corrective
8 glasses, or central visual acuity of more than 20/200 if there is a field of defect in which the
9 peripheral field has contracted to such an extent that the widest diameter of visual field subtends
10 an angular distance no greater than twenty degrees in the better eye, or any other disability or
11 handicap of such veterans which may be determined by the medical advisory board as
12 established by section eight C,” in lines 131 to 142, inclusive, and inserting in place thereof the
13 following:- “have been determined by the United States Veterans Administration to have a
14 service connected disability rating of 60 percent or greater.”
