### AN ACT RELATIVE TO LONG TERM CARE INCENTIVES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Paragraph (b) of Part B of section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as
2	appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding, after subparagraph (5), the
3	following subparagraph:-
4	(6) In the case of an individual who purchases a qualified long-term care insurance policy, as
5	defined by chapter 176Q, including both nursing facility and home health benefits, an amount
6	equal to 100 per cent of the annual premium of the insurance policy not to exceed \$5,000.
7	Married individuals filing jointly or separately are each entitled to an exemption from taxable
8	income equal to 100 per cent of the annual premium but not more than \$5,000.
9 10	SECTION 2. Chapter 63 of the general laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding, after section 37A the following new section:-
11	Section 37A $\frac{1}{2}$ . A business entity under this chapter is allowed a credit against the tax
12	imposed by this chapter for each taxable year that begins on July 1, 2011 equal to fifteen percent

- 13 of the costs incurred by the taxpaying business entity in providing long-term care coverage, as
- 14 defined in section 1 of chapter 176Q, as part of a benefit package to its employees.
