## AN ACT RELATIVE TO REVERSE MORTGAGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Subsection (i) of Section 7 of chapter 167 E is hereby repealed.

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3           SECTION 2. Definitions

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5           “Authorized Reverse Mortgage Loan Originator” (“ARLO”) shall mean a Mortgage Loan Originator  
6 approved by the DOB to negotiate, arrange, or sell Reverse Mortgages to Consumers. A person whose  
7 activities are ministerial and clerical will not be deemed to be acting as an ARLO.

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9           “Consumer” means a natural person who is a resident of Massachusetts who seeks or obtains a mortgage  
10 loan secured by the Consumer’s principal residence in Massachusetts.

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12           “the division” shall mean the Massachusetts Division of Banking.

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14           “Commissioner” means the Commissioner of the DOB

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16 “Reverse Mortgage” means a nonrecourse Mortgage Loan in which: (1) a mortgage, deed of trust, or  
17 equivalent consensual security interest securing one or more advances is created in the Consumer’s  
18 principal dwelling located in Massachusetts; and (2) any principal, interest, or shared appreciation or  
19 equity is due and payable (other than in the case of default) only after: (i) the Consumer dies; (ii) the  
20 dwelling is transferred; or (iii) the Consumer ceased to occupy the dwelling as a principal dwelling

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22 SECTION 3. Said chapter 167E is hereby amended by inserting after section 7 the following section:-

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24 Section 7A. Licensure of Reverse Mortgage Loan Originators

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26 (a) No natural person shall act as an authorized reverse mortgage loan originator unless such person  
27 has first obtained an authorized reverse mortgage loan originator license from the commissioner. A  
28 natural person who meets the definition of an authorized reverse mortgage loan originator, prior to  
29 enactment of this section, shall file an application and obtain a license from the commissioner within one  
30 hundred eighty (180) days of the enactment of this section. An entity shall not knowingly employ or  
31 retain a reverse mortgage loan originator unless the reverse mortgage loan originator is licensed  
32 hereunder.

33 (b) The commissioner shall adopt rules and regulations relative to the lending practices relative to  
34 reverse mortgages, including but not limited to; an application for a license shall be in writing and in the  
35 form prescribed by the commissioner, signed under the pains and penalties of perjury, and shall contain  
36 the name, address and license number of the entity with whom a mortgage loan originator is employed or  
37 associated and other information as the commissioner may require, including evidence of compliance of  
38 subsection (b). Such application shall also include a description of the activities of the application, in  
39 such detail and for such periods as the Commissioner may require, as well as such further information as  
40 the Commissioner may require. The Division shall investigate each applicant and such investigation shall  
41 include a criminal records check based on the fingerprints of the applicant and a civil records check. The  
42 Division shall require each applicant to file a set of the applicant’s fingerprints, taken by a law  
43 enforcement agency, and any other information necessary to complete a statewide and nationwide  
44 criminal check with the Criminal Investigation Bureau of the Department of Justice for state processing  
45 and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for federal processing. All costs associated with the criminal  
46 history check shall be determined annually by the Commissioner of administration under the provisions

47 of Section three B (3B) of Chapter Seven (7). All costs associated with the criminal history check are the  
48 responsibility of the applicant. Criminal history records provided to the Division under this section are  
49 confidential and the Division may use the records only to determine if the applicant is eligible for  
50 licensure. The commissioner shall adopt such regulations on or before July 1, 2009.
