AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CREATION OF THE FIRE PREVENTION REGULATIONS APPEALS BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 22D of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding the
- 2 following new section:-
- 4 "(5)(A) There is hereby established a Fire Prevention Regulations Appeals Board. The Board shall
- 5 consist of the thirteen members of the Board of Fire Prevention Regulations, established pursuant to
- 6 section 4.

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- 8 The Governor shall from time to time designate a member of said board as Chairman. The State Fire
- 9 Marshal, and heads of fire departments serving on this board shall receive no compensation for their
- services on the board. All other members of said board shall each be paid fifty dollars for each day while
- in actual performance of his duties but such pay shall not exceed two thousand five hundred dollars in any

12 fiscal year for each eligible member plus all expenses necessarily incurred by him in connection with his 13 official duties as such member of the Appeals Board. 14 15 The board may, subject to appropriation, with the approval of the State Fire Marshal, employ such clerical, technical, and other assistants as may be required by such board. 16 17 18 (B) Whoever is aggrieved by any act, rule, order, decision, requirement, or direction, by any state or local 19 Official charged with the enforcement of the state fire code, relative to the fire protection requirements 20 relating to buildings or structures, may within forty-five days after the service of notice thereof, appeal 21 from said act, rule, order, decision, requirement, or direction to said appeals board. 22 23 Appeals hereunder shall be on a form as provided by the appeals board and shall be accompanied by such 24 fee as said appeals board may determine. The state, city, or town officer in charge of the records and all other persons in possession or control of such records papers and documents relative to an appeal, shall 25 26 forthwith, upon request of the appeals board, transmit such papers and documents to said appeals board. 27 An appeal shall stay all proceedings in the furtherance of the action or failure to act which is the subject 28 of the appeal, unless said enforcement authority presents evidence that a stay would cause imminent peril 29 of life or property. 30 31 The chairman of the appeals board shall designate any three members of the appeals board to hold 32 hearings under this section and to hear testimony and take evidence. The appeals board shall not be bound by the strict rules of evidence prevailing in courts of law or equity. 33

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
