## AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE HELMET LAW STANDARDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 7 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004 1 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following words at the end of said paragraph:-2 In accordance with the Federal laws as stated in Section 1392(d) of the National Traffic and 3 Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966, no citations or fines shall be issued to any motorcycle 4 5 operator or passenger who is wearing a helmet that may not be in conformity with protective headgear standard set forth by the registrar unless (a) a determination of non-compliance for said 6 7 helmet model has been issued by the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration; 8 (b) a manufacturer recall of said helmet model has been issued because of non-compliance with 9 FMVSS 218; and (c) there is proof that the operator has actual knowledge of a determination of 10 non-conformity with federal standards and of a manufacturer recall of said helmet because of non-compliance with the protective headgear standard set forth by the registrar. 11
