## AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS OF ASSISTANT TREASURES AND COLLECTORS.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation for this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is forthwith to make , therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. The sixth and seventh sentences of section 39A of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the words “and a resident of  
3 the commonwealth”.

5           SECTION 2. The sixth and seventh sentences of section 39C of said chapter 41 of the General Laws is  
6 hereby further amended by striking out the words “and a resident of the commonwealth”.

8           SECTION 3. This act will take effect upon its passage.
