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**In the Year Two Thousand and Nine**

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**AN ACT TO PROMOTE SELF-SUFFICIENCY.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 110 (d) of Chapter 5 of the Acts of 1995 is hereby amended by  
2 inserting after the end of the first paragraph the following paragraph: -

3           “Notwithstanding any law or provision to the contrary, families ineligible for cash assistance  
4 may be considered recipients for purposes of eligibility for employment support program funded  
5 services, including child care, provided that such services are made available for the purpose of  
6 enabling recipients to begin and/or maintain employment, and that a sliding scale is used to  
7 administer those benefits in a manner consistent with facilitating economic independence.”

8           SECTION 2. The Secretary of Health and Human Services, the Secretary of Administration and  
9 Finance, and the Commissioner of the Department of Transitional Assistance are hereby  
10 authorized and directed to develop a methodology for the implementation of Section 1 above, by  
11 which employment support program funded services are provided to recipients for the purposes

12 of encouraging them to begin or maintain employment without suffering a disadvantage as  
13 compared to remaining unemployed in order to receive any and all available benefits.

14 SECTION 3. The provisions of Section 1 shall become effective one year following the passage  
15 of this Act. The methodology required by Section 2 shall be developed not later than six months  
16 following the passage of this Act.
